988—Suicide & Crisis Lifeline

The Suicide and Crisis Lifeline can help prevent suicide in individuals of *ALL* ages. The Lifeline provides 24/7, free and confidential support for people in distress, prevention and crisis resources for you or your loved ones. Call the Lifeline, 988, anytime 24/7. When people call, text, or chat 988, they will be connected to trained counselors that are part of the existing Lifeline network. These trained counselors will listen, understand how their problems are affecting them, provide support, and connect them to resources if necessary.

MASSHEALTH REDETERMINATION

Continuous coverage requirements that started during the COVID 19 pandemic are due to end on April 1st and so all MassHealth recipients will need to renew their coverage. If MassHealth has enough information to confirm eligibility, coverage will be renewed automatically. Any MassHealth recipient who is not automatically renewed should look out for a blue envelope in the mail which contains a renewal form that should be filled in and returned within 45 days of the date on the letter. Alternatively, this can be done online or via a phone call. In preparation for this letter, all MassHealth recipients should ensure that MassHealth has their up-todate address, phone number and email and that they **report any household changes**.

Federal COVID Extra SNAP Program Ending!

Starting April 1st, 2023, you will receive 1 monthly SNAP payment which is your normal benefit. You may increase your benefit by verifying your medical costs over \$35.00 a month for ANYONE in your SNAP household who is 60 years+ or has a disability. An Out-of-Pocket Medical Expenses Form needs to be completed. Please contact Robin Tobin, Outreach Worker, 508-384-5425, to obtain this form, or calling the DTA Connect at 877-382-

Heating & Utility LIHEAP (Low Income Heating Energy Assistance Program). The 2022-2023 LIHEAP Season continues to accept applications. This Program helps keep families safe and warm through the winter months by assisting families with energy costs. LIHEAP federally funded assistance to reduce the costs associated with home energy bills, energy crises, weatherization, and minor energy-related home repairs. Good Neighbor Energy Fund (GNEF):

The Massachusetts Good Neighbor Energy Fund is available to any Massachusetts resident who, because of temporary financial difficulty, cannot meet a month's energy expense and is not eligible for state or federal energy assistance.
